PREFACE

1. Introduction and Constitutional Mandate

It is with great privilege that I present the Annual Report of the Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh for the year 2025 to the Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh, in accordance with sub-section 5 of Section 12 of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act, 1983. This report provides a detailed account of the activities and accomplishments of the Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh for the period from January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025. It also highlights the functions and organizational structure of the institution, which continues to serve as a vital instrument for curbing the evil of corruption and maladministration.

Since the Office of the Hon'ble Lokayukta is currently vacant, the duties of the Hon'ble Lokayukta have been discharged by the Upa-Lokayukta since September 15, 2024, ensuring continuity in our mission to provide redressal to the grievances of citizens. Rooted in the recommendations of the Administrative Reforms Commission of 1966 and modelled after the Ombudsman institutions of Scandinavian countries, this Institution remains steadfast in offering informal, expeditious, and accessible justice, free from executive control.

2. Operational Performance and Public Engagement

The year 2025 witnessed a robust engagement with the public, reflecting a growing confidence in the Institution's ability to deliver justice.

- **Case Flow:** The Institution received 3,106 fresh complaints during the year. When combined with the pending backlog of 4,325 complaints from the previous year, the total caseload available for disposal stood at 7,431.

- **Disposal Rate:** Through diligent judicial and administrative efforts, we successfully disposed of 3,654 complaints in 2025. Notably, the number of resolved cases exceeded the number of fresh receipts, effectively reducing the pendency backlog.
- **Departmental Focus:** Statistical analysis reveals that nearly 50% of the complaints received pertained to the Revenue Department, indicating a critical area requiring sustained oversight.
- **Transparency:** Upholding the principles of transparency, the Institution received 148 applications under the Right to Information Act, all of which were disposed of effectively.

3. Financial Accountability and Asset Recovery

One of the most significant achievements of the reporting period has been the tangible recovery of public funds. The Lokayukta's interventions led to the recovery of a total sum of Rs. 15,29,10,115/- (Rupees Fifteen Crores Twenty-Nine Lakhs Ten Thousand One Hundred and Fifteen).

Key instances of financial enforcement include:

- **Mineral Revenue:** A substantial recovery of Rs. 4.99 Crores was affected from M/s. Vasistha Projects regarding Seigniorage charges and security deposits for illegal excavation in Kaptrala Village.
- **Library Cess:** In a major systemic correction, Rs. 3.66 Crores in Library Cess dues, which had been pending from 2007 to 2017 in East Godavari District, were recovered and remitted to the Zilla Grandhalaya Samstha.
- **Stamp Duty:** The Institution detected irregularities in the registration of documents at SRO Adoni, leading to the recovery of Rs. 20.26 Lakhs caused by the undervaluation of property.
- **Rural Development Funds:** We addressed the misappropriation of MGNREGS funds, recovering Rs. 24.21 Lakhs in Nizampatnam Village alone, alongside recoveries in other Mandals for similar offenses.

4. Enforcing Integrity: Disciplinary Actions

The Lokayukta has maintained a zero-tolerance approach toward lack of integrity in public service. Based on our inquiries and recommendations, Competent Authorities have imposed severe penalties on erring officials.

- **Dismissal for Fraud:** Five employees of the Telugu Ganga Project, Tirupati, were dismissed from service for securing employment using fake land acquisition award copies. Criminal cases were also registered against them.
- **Removal for Absence:** To ensure the availability of healthcare, 55 Medical Officers were removed from service for unauthorized absence, following our recommendations.
- **Penalties for Corruption:** In a case involving the issuance of bogus house site pattas in exchange for bribes, the government imposed a reduction in rank on a former Tahsildar and withheld increments for a Village Revenue Officer. Similarly, a Sub-Registrar faced a stoppage of increments for three years for causing revenue loss to the state.

5. Proactive Governance through Suo-Motu Interventions

Moving beyond reactive adjudication, the Institution exercised its *Suo-Motu* powers to address systemic maladministration reported in the media.

- **Protection of Migrant Children:** We intervened in the management of "Seasonal Hostels" under the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan. Our directions led to the blacklisting of four hostel organizers, the imposition of fines on eleven others, and the institution of a strict inspection regime by District Educational Officers to ensure proper food and care for migrant children.
- **Pensioner Welfare:** Addressing reports of corruption in Treasury offices where pensioners were harassed for bribes, we directed the establishment of Help Line Numbers at District Treasuries in Kurnool and Nandyal to ensure grievance redressal without delay.
- **Public Health:** We took strict cognizance of the use of harmful chemicals like calcium carbide for fruit ripening. Authorities were directed to constitute District Level Committees and intensify inspections to prevent health hazards.
- **Education Rights:** When educational institutions illegally withheld original certificates of students due to pending fee reimbursement claims, we recommended the Higher Education Department to ensure the immediate release of certificates, safeguarding the students' future.

6. Redressal of Grievances

The soul of this Institution lies in providing relief to the individual citizen. In 2025, we resolved 174 personal grievances to the full satisfaction of the complainants.

- **Long-Pending Compensation:** We successfully resolved an 11-year-old grievance regarding the Guru Raghavendra Water Project, ensuring crop compensation was paid to farmers in Chilakaladona Village whose lands were submerged due to erroneous Full Tank Level fixation in 2014.
- **Humanitarian Relief:** The Institution facilitated the speedy payment of ex-gratia to legal heirs of victims of thunderbolts and electrical accidents.
- **Land and Civic Issues:** We oversaw the removal of encroachments on government lands and water bodies, the correction of revenue records, and the restoration of public pathways, thereby upholding the rule of law at the grassroots level.

7. Conclusion

The Institution of Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh continues to operate with fiscal prudence within a budget of approximately Rs. 9.46 Crores, while delivering substantial value to the State and its citizens. The increasing inflow of complaints is a testament to the rising public trust in this body as an effective forum for accountability.

As we move forward, we remain committed to our core mission: to stand as a barrier against corruption and a beacon of hope for the aggrieved. We record our appreciation for the cooperation extended by the various investigative and administrative wings of the Government in implementing our recommendations. It is our firm resolve to continue marching forward as an effective instrument in the hands of the public for curbing the evil of corruption and maladministration.

INTRODUCTION

Period of the Report:-

This report pertains to the functions of Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta for the period from 01.01.2025 to 31.12.2025.

Name of Hon'ble Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh during the Year 2025:-

Hon'ble Smt. P. Rajani, Upa-Lokayukta(Full Additional Charge) -Lokayukta.

Name of Hon'ble Upa-Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh during the Year 2025:-

Hon'ble Smt. P. Rajani - Upa-Lokayukta.

Since, the Office of Hon'ble Lokayukta is currently vacant, the duties of Hon'ble Lokayukta has been discharged by the Hon'ble Upa-Lokayukta during the period covered by this Annual Report.

ABOUT THE INSTITUTION OF LOKAYUKTA OF ANDHRA PRADESH

ORGANIZATION:

In order to redress the grievances of the citizens which were pouring more in number, the Administrative Reforms Commission, appointed by the Union Government in 1966, recommended the constitution of the Institutions of Lokayukta and Upa-Lokayukta, taking a clue from the Institution like OMBUDSMAN in the Scandinavian countries. In the light of those recommendations, the Institutions of Lokayukta were established in various States of our country with jurisdiction to deal with complaints not only against elective public servants, but also against the other categories of public servants defined in the Act.

In Andhra Pradesh, the A.P. Lokayukta Act 11 of 1983 came into force with effect from 1-11-1983 and this Institution started functioning from 15-11-1983 and since then this Institution has been able to march forward as an effective instrument in the hands of the public for curbing the evil of corruption and maladministration.

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE INSTITUTION:

The most prominent features of the Institution of Lokayukta in this State are: -

- i) Independence from Executive Control;
- ii) Informal procedure and easy accessibility to complaints; and
- iii) Almost free and prompt services to the citizens.

FUNCTIONS & DUTIES:

The matters and actions of Public servants, which can form the subject matter of the complaint to the Institution of Lokayukta and Upa-Lokayukta, are:

- 1) Any administrative action involving abuse of power for personal gain or to harm anyone;
- 2) Administrative actions motivated by improper or corrupt motives causing loss to the State or to any person; and
- 3) All actions involving outright corruption or lack of integrity.

There are three modes for the Lokayukta and the Upa-Lokayukta to act for taking up investigation of Administrative actions of the nature as stated above.

Firstly, any citizen or aggrieved person can make a complaint. Secondly, the Lokayukta and Upa-Lokayukta Suo-moto can take up investigation on the basis of information received by him otherwise than by way of complaints like newspapers, reports, etc. Thirdly, the Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta can act on a reference from the Governor.

For the purpose of conducting an investigation in accordance with the provisions of the Act, the Assembly of the new state of Andhra Pradesh approved that in addition to only serving Chief Justices or sitting judges, even retired Chief Justices or retired Justices can be considered to be eligible for appointment for the position as the State Lokayukta. Further, the Governor appoints one or more District Judges to act as Upa-Lokayuktas.

Peshi of the Lokayukta:

Peshi of The Lokayukta consists of Personal Secretary to Lokayukta, Personal Assistant to Lokayukta, Driver, Jamedar and Two Attenders.

Peshi of the Upa Lokayukta:

Peshi of The Upa Lokayukta consists of Personal Assistant to Upa Lokayukta, Driver, Jamedar and an Attender.

ADMINISTRATION:-

Registrar:

Overall administration of Office of the Institution of Lokayukta is under the charge of the Registrar, who is designated as the **Head of the Department**.

The Role of the Registrar

All the complaints filed before the Institution of Lokayukta will be addressed to the Registrar and all the correspondence of the Institution of Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh will be conducted in the name of the Registrar.

The Registrar

- i) administers office of the Institution of Lokayukta, taking instructions from Hon'ble the Lokayukta on all policy matters.
- ii) scrutinizes the complaints and places them before Hon'ble the Lokayukta for consideration and necessary action.
- iii) assists the Hon'ble Lokayukta in the preparation of the Annual Report to be submitted to The Hon'ble Governor of the State.
- iv) assists the Hon'ble Lokayukta in recruiting the officers and staff members of the Institution.
- v) assists the Hon'ble Lokayukta in fixing Vacation of the Hon'ble Lokayukta and the Hon'ble Upa-Lokayukta and also Public Holidays etc., for the establishment of the Institution.
- vi) holds the overall in-charge of the administration of the Office of the Institution of Lokayukta including financial, budgetary, service matters of the officers and staff members, allocation of duties of officers and staff members and all other related functions for running the Office of the Institution of Lokayukta.
- vii) acts as the First Appellate Authority under Right to Information Act-2005.

Peshi of the Registrar:

Peshi of the Registrar consists of Personal Assistant to Registrar, a Driver and an Attender.

To assist the Lokayukta and the Upa-Lokayukta the organization is divided into four functional wings, which are as under

- (A) Administration Wing**
- (B) Judicial Wing**
- (C) Legal Wing**
- (D) Investigation Wing**
- (A) Administration Wing:**

The Registrar with the Assistance of the Deputy Registrar, supervises the Administration Wing, which consists of two sections, which are

- (i) Establishment Section and
- (ii) Accounts Section.

The Deputy Registrar:

The Deputy Registrar assists the Registrar in overall supervision of the functioning of the Office of the Institution of Lokayukta. In addition, the Deputy Registrar is the Drawing and Disbursing Officer of the Institution. The Deputy Registrar is designated as Public Information Officer under the Right to Information Act, 2005.

(i) Establishment Section:

The Establishment Section is headed by an Assistant Register, who functions with the assistance of the Section Officer.

The Establishment Section deals with recruitment of staff, service matters of officers and staff members like promotions, salary fixations, increments and other conditions of service and also maintenance of Service Registers and all other required registers. This section also deals with purchase and maintenance of Library, Stores, Furniture, Motor Vehicles, Stationery, Photocopying Machine (Xerox), etc. Management of the events like Republic Day, Independence Day, etc. are also under the purview of this section. Further, maintenance of the premises is also under the purview of this section. The Inward and Dispatch Sections also work under Establishment Section.

For proper running of this section, apart from the Assistant Registrar and Section Officer, an Assistant Section Officer, Librarian, Stores In-charge, Stenographers, Typists, Assistants, Dispatch Clerk, Inward Clerk, Roneo Operator, Motor Vehicle Messenger, Driver, Attenders, Chowkidars, Gardeners, Sweeper-cum-Scavengers are required.

(ii) Accounts Section:

The Accounts Section is headed by Assistant Registrar (Accounts) who is assisted by the Accounts Officer, the Assistant Section Officer, U.D. Accountant, Typist, Assistant and Attender.

The Accounts Officer is the custodian of the Permanent Advance amount of the Office.

The Accounts Section deals with submitting budget proposals to the Government, receiving budget, preparation and submitting pay bills and other bills

like Medical, Purchase Bills etc., deducting Income Tax at source from the salaries, receiving and remitting the complaint fees & RTIP fees etc., and maintenance of ledgers and other registers pertaining to the financial matters of the office.

(B) Judicial Wing:

Judicial Wing consists of five sections viz., (i)Complaints Section, (ii)Judicial B-1 Section, (iii)Judicial B-2 Section (iv)Record Room & (v)RTI Section. All these five sections function under the overall supervision of Assistant Registrar (Judicial).

(i) Complaints Section:

Assistant Registrar and Section Officer with the assistance of an Assistant Section Officer, Stenographers, Typists, Assistants and Attenders administers this section. Complaints filed by the Complainants will be processed, scrutinized, and registered in this section and the relevant registers are maintained by this section.

The complaints are segregated under due procedure and the matters are registered as B1 complaints and B2 complaints. B1 complaints are placed before the Lokayukta and B2 complaints before the Upa-Lokayukta for consideration and redressal.

(ii) Judicial B-1 Section:

This section deals with the Bench of the Lokayukta. One Section Officer for attending the Bench and the other for looking after the section, assisted by Assistant Section Officers, Stenographers, Typists, Assistants, Record Assistants and Attenders to run this section.

The complaints registered as B1 complaints, for being resolved by Lokayukta, are dealt with in B1 section.

The files received from Complaints Section, are attended to in this Section by placing them before the Lokayukta for securing relevant orders on the days of posting of the same. Further, this Section processes the orders passed by the Lokayukta by way of calling for reports/comments etc., from the concerned, as per the orders. This Section prepares Cause Lists, maintains the records, files and relevant registrars in connection with the various complaints received in this Section, till the said complaints reach their logical conclusion/disposal.

After disposal, the files relating to the disposed-off complaints will be consigned to the record room.

(iii) Judicial B-2 Section:

The complaints registered as B2 complaints, for being resolved by Upa-Lokayukta, are dealt with in B2 section.

This section deals with the Bench of the Upa-Lokayukta. Two Section Officers, one for attending the Bench and the other for looking after the section, assisted by Assistant Section Officers, Stenographers, Typists, Assistants, Record Assistants and Attenders, run this section.

The files received from Complaints Section, are attended to in this Section by placing them before the Upa-Lokayukta for securing relevant orders. Further, this Section processes the orders passed by the Upa-Lokayukta by way of calling for reports/comments etc., from the concerned. This Section also prepares Cause Lists, maintains the records, files and relevant registrars in connection with the various complaints received in this Section, till the said complaints reach their logical conclusion/disposal.

After disposal, the files relating to the disposed-off complaints will be consigned to the record room.

(iv) Record Room:

Record Room is manned by a Section Officer, assisted by an Assistant Section Officer, Assistant, Record Assistant and an Attender.

All the disposed-off records, closed registers and files will be kept in the Record Room for safe keeping, after entering into relevant registers.

(v) Right to Information Section:

Several applications are being received from the general public under The Right to Information Act-2005.

As mandated in The Right to Information Act-2005, the officers of Institution are designated in various capacities to deal with the applications received under the said Act.

The Assistant Registrar is designated as Assistant Public Information Officer under The Right to Information Act-2005.

The Deputy Registrar is designated as Public Information Officer under The Right to Information Act-2005.

The Registrar is designated as First Appellate Authority under The Right to Information Act-2005.

All these officers are being assisted by an Assistant Section Officer, Assistant, and an Attender.

(C) Legal Wing:

This Legal Wing consists of two Offices:-

- (i) The Office of the Director (Legal) &
- (ii) The Office of the Deputy Director (Legal).

(i) The office of the Director (Legal):

The Director (Legal) is a Category-II Officer. He assists the Lokayukta in dealing with and disposal of the complaints. He will be functioning with the assistance of a Special Category Stenographer, a Typist, an Assistant, a Driver and an Attender.

B-1 Section is dealing with the complaints being placed before the Lokayukta for consideration and disposal. The Director (Legal) assists the Lokayukta in connection with the complaints being processed and dealt with by B-1 Section.

The Director (Legal) assists Lokayukta in day to day dealing of the listed cases in B-1 Section, during call work. He prepares Brief Notes after examining the various reports received from the Public Servants and also various documents which come up for consideration in connection with the complaints, to assist Lokayukta. Further, he gives his Legal Opinions when the matters are referred for the same by the Lokayukta.

The Director (Legal) assists the proceedings during Final Investigation of the complaints by preparing the Statement of Allegations against the Public Servants, the list of witnesses to be examined during the Final Investigation and also list of documents to be confronted to the witnesses during recording of the evidence.

Further, if the Complainant has no legal assistance, during the Final Investigation, the Director (Legal) will be presenting the case of the Complainant before the Lokayukta and also lead the evidence on behalf of the Complainant to assist

the proceedings. He will be advancing arguments also on behalf of the Complainant, if he got no legal assistance.

(ii) The office of the Deputy Director (Legal):

The Deputy Director (Legal) is a Category-III Officer. He assists the Upa-Lokayukta in dealing with and disposal of the complaints. He will be functioning with the assistance of a Special Category Stenographer, a Typist, an Assistant, a Driver and an Attender.

B-2 Section deals with the complaints being placed before the Upa-Lokayukta for consideration and disposal. The Deputy Director (Legal) assists the Upa-Lokayukta in connection with the complaints being processed and dealt with by B-2 Section.

The Deputy Director (Legal) assists Upa-Lokayukta in day to day dealing of the listed cases in B-2 Section during call work. He prepares Brief Notes of the various reports received from the Public Servants and others and also various documents which come up for consideration in connection with the complaints, to assist Upa-Lokayukta. Further, he gives his Legal Opinions when the matters are referred for the same by the Upa-Lokayukta.

The Deputy Director (Legal) assists the proceedings during Final Investigation of the complaints by preparing the Statement of Allegations against the Public Servants, the list of witnesses to be examined during the Final Investigation and also list of documents to be confronted to the witnesses during recording of the evidence.

Further, if the Complainant has no legal assistance, during the Final Investigation, the Deputy Director (Legal) will present the case of the Complainant before the Upa-Lokayukta and also lead the evidence on behalf of the Complainant to assist the proceedings. He will be advancing arguments also on behalf of the Complainant, if the complainant has no legal assistance.

(D) Investigation Wing:

There is an Investigation Wing consisting of the Posts of Director (Investigation) and several Investigation Officers. These officers assist the Lokayukta and the Upa-Lokayukta in the investigation to be held into the various allegations made against the Public Servants in the complaints filed before this Institution.

The Director (Investigation) who is of the rank of Inspector General of Police is heading the Investigation Wing. He functions with the assistance of Deputy Directors (5 in number), Investigating Officers (2 in number), Head Constables(2 in number) and Police Constables (6 in number). Further, a Stenographer, a Typist, a Driver and an Attender are working in the Investigation Wing.

The Investigation Wing probes in to the allegations referred to them by the Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta and after making such confidential probe as required, submits report together with any documents or other material collected during such confidential probe. The Investigation Officers conduct discreet enquiries in connection with the allegations and the reports being submitted by them are immense help to the Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta in determining the veracity of the given complaint and whether to proceed with further investigation in the allegations, made therein or otherwise.

The Investigation Wing maintains utmost confidentiality and secrecy of information during the discreet enquiry being made by it and conducts probe into the allegations most impartially.

When occasion arises, the office will be entrusting Summons to be served on the witnesses/parties to the complaint and also Warrants to be executed on such persons, to the Investigation Wing for Service of Summons/Execution of the Warrants and they will be discharging the said functions also, most effectively, submit compliance reports and assist the Institution.

The officers who conduct investigation may sometimes be required to give their evidence during Final Investigation, in connection with the enquiries made by them and the reports submitted by them.

ACCOMMODATION:-

The Institution of Lokayukta is presently accommodated in a rented building bearing D.No. 96/3-72-124-1, Santosh Nagar, Kurnool, consists of Ground + 3 floors.

Out of the Total Budget Allocated an amount of Rs.6,00,000/- from Non-Salaries HOA-137 has been reappropriated to HOA-217 and an amount of Rs.9,00,000/- has been allotted by way of Additional Funds totalling to Rs.15,00,000/-. Hence, the Revised Budget Estimates Allocated under various Heads of Accounts for the Financial Year 2025-2026 is Rs.9,46,44,000/-.

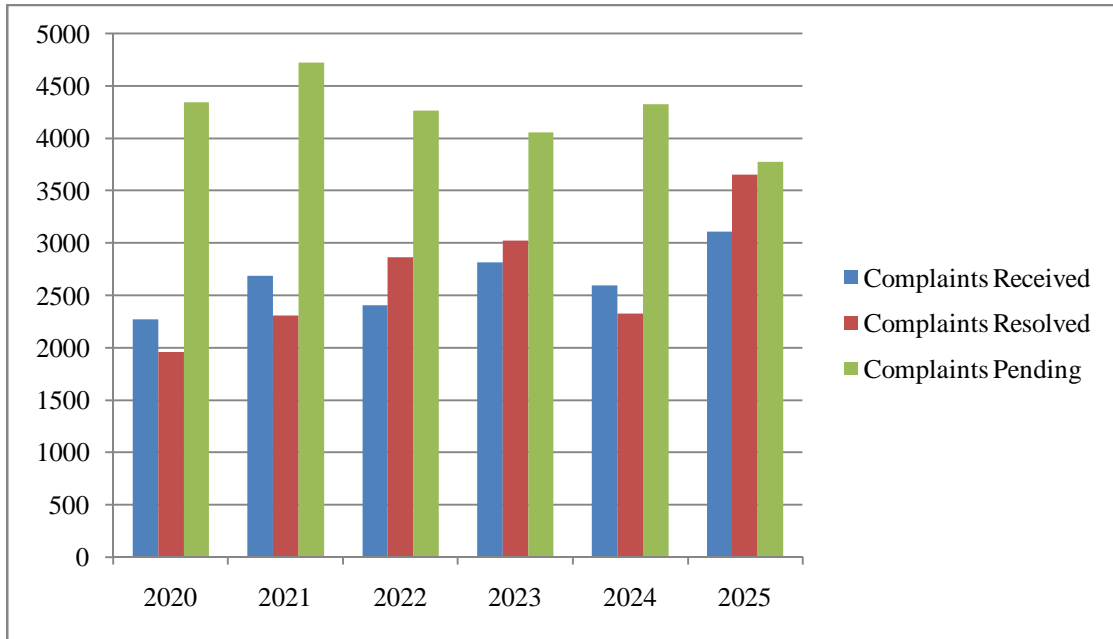

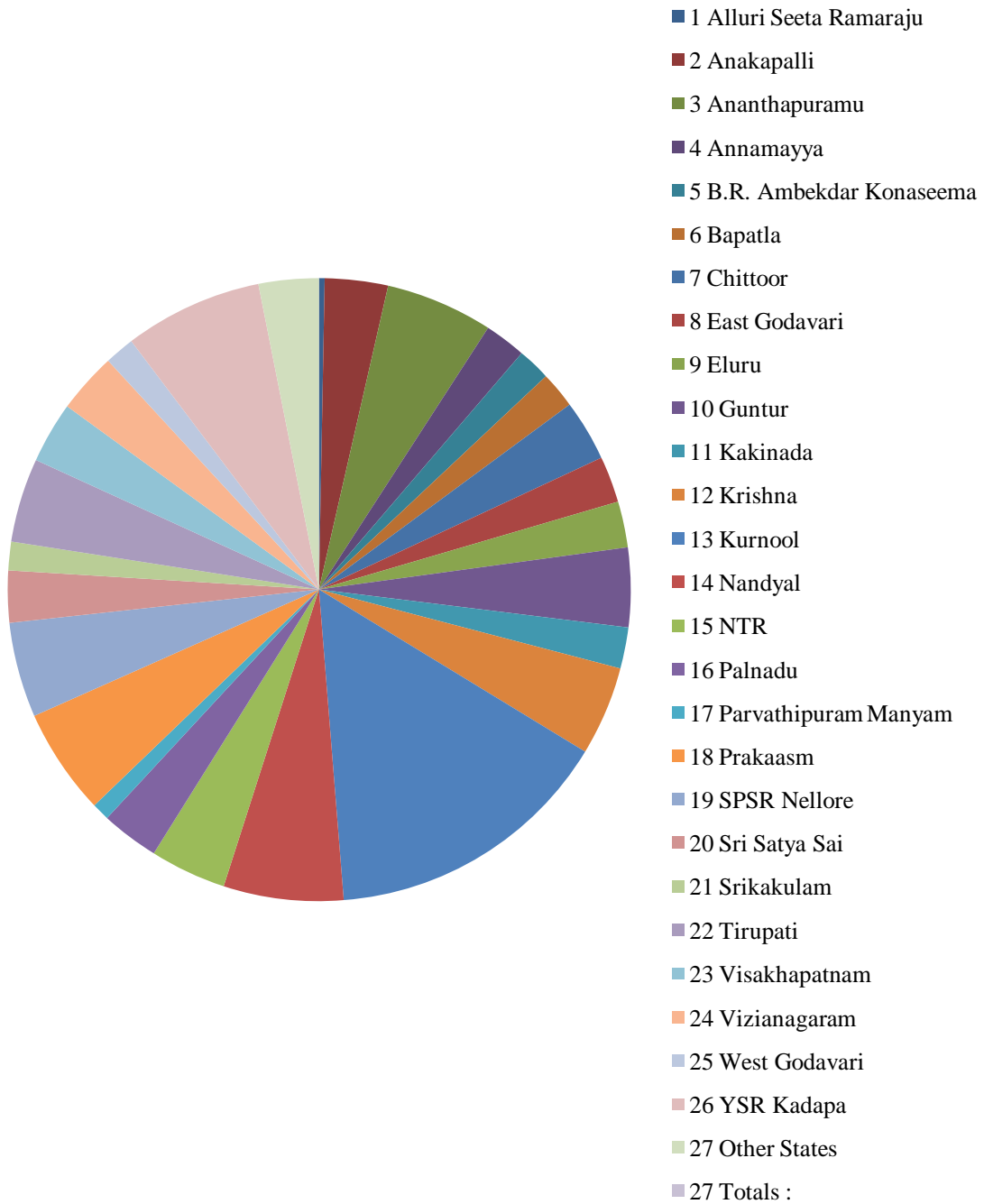

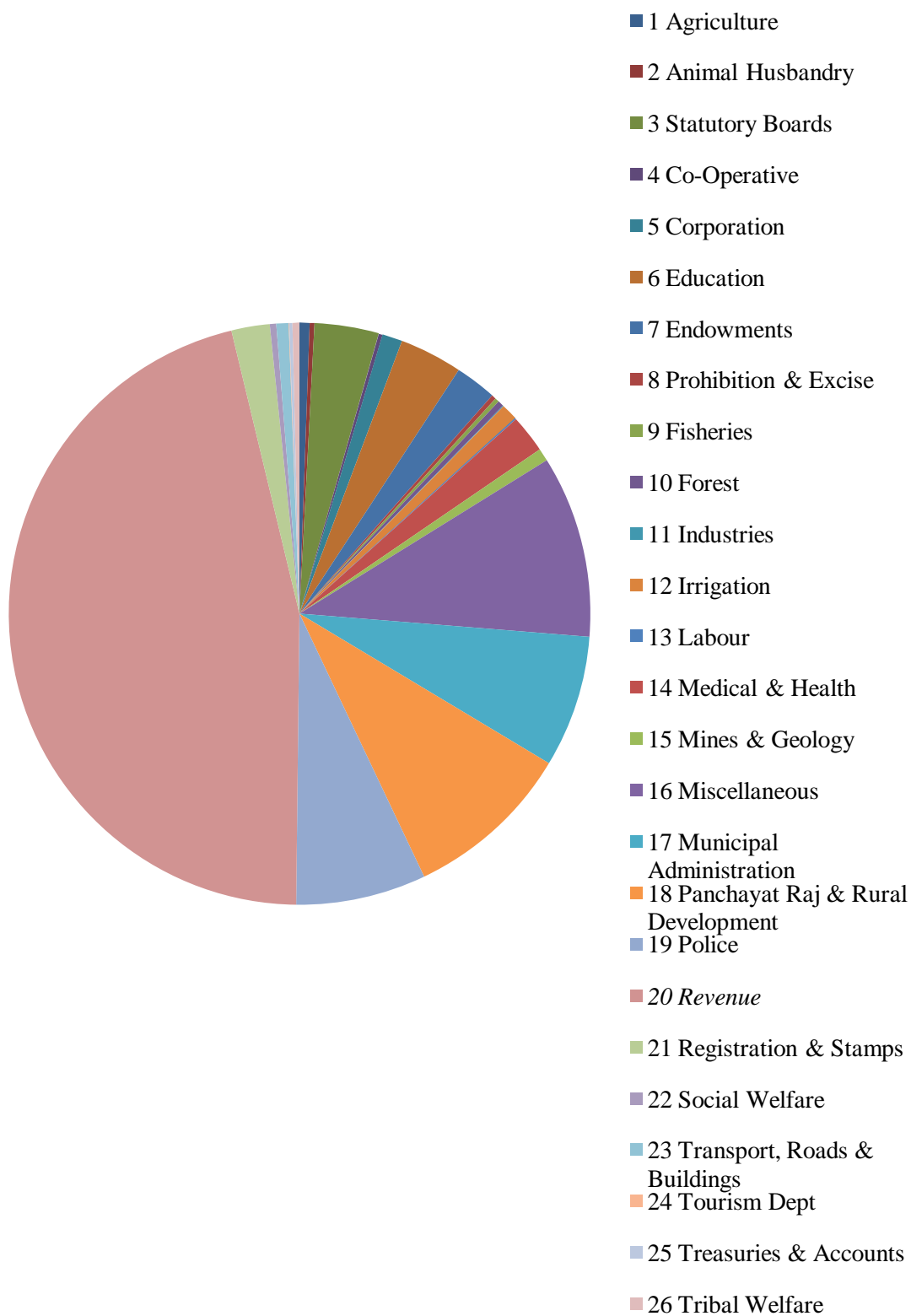
DISTRICT WISE COMPLAINTS STATUS FOR THE YEAR - 2025

A QUESTION AND ANSWER GUIDE TO LOKAYUKTA FUNCTIONING

What is Lokayukta?

The Lokayukta is a statutory Institution established under the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act, 1983, to address corruption, maladministration, and abuse of official position by public servants and government authorities in the State of Andhra Pradesh. The Institution functions as an independent and impartial authority to promote integrity, transparency, accountability, and good governance in public administration.

The role of the Lokayukta is not confined only to corruption-related matters. It also extends to redressal of citizens' grievances arising out of delay, inefficiency, arbitrariness, lack of transparency, and improper conduct by public authorities. Through investigation, inquiry, and recommendations, the Lokayukta safeguards citizens' rights and strengthens public confidence in governance.

What are the powers and jurisdiction of the AP Lokayukta?

The jurisdiction of the A.P. Lokayukta extends to a wide range of public servants as defined under Section 2(k) of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act, 1983. These include, among others:

- Ministers of the State (except the Chief Minister)
- Members of either House of the State Legislature, including the Chief Whip
- Persons appointed to public services or posts in connection with the affairs of the State of Andhra Pradesh
- Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of Zilla Parishads
- Presidents of Mandal Parishads
- Mayors of Municipal Corporations
- Chairpersons of Municipal Councils
- Chairpersons, Presidents, and Directors of Governing Bodies of Local Authorities
- Officers and employees of Local Authorities, Universities, Statutory Bodies, Corporations, Societies, and other Institutions
- Vice-Chancellors and Registrars of Universities
- Office bearers of Societies registered under the A.P. Societies Registration Act and Co-operative Societies operating at District or State level

The Lokayukta has the power to inquire into allegations of corruption, favoritism, abuse of power, maladministration, official indiscipline, and other improper conduct by public servants and to recommend appropriate action.

What is the composition of the Lokayukta Institution?

The Institution consists of:

- Lokayukta, who is the head of the Institution, and
- One or more Upa-Lokayuktas, as may be appointed by the Governor of Andhra Pradesh.

They function independently but in coordination, as per the Act.

Are there any categories of complaints that are not entertained?

Yes. Certain categories of complaints are liable for rejection as per Rule 4 of the AP Lokayukta and Upa-Lokayukta (Investigation) Rules, and the provisions of the Act. These include:

A. Grounds for rejection in limine

A complaint may be rejected at the threshold if:

- It does not disclose any allegation that can be investigated by the Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta
- It is frivolous, vexatious, or not made in good faith
- There are no sufficient grounds for investigation
- Alternative and effective remedies are available and it is appropriate for the complainant to pursue those remedies
- The public servant complained against does not fall within the jurisdiction of the Lokayukta
- The complaint is filed after the expiry of six years from the date of the alleged action
- An earlier complaint on the same allegations has already been disposed of by the Lokayukta, Upa-Lokayukta, or any other competent authority

B. Nature of disputes not entertained

- Civil disputes between private individuals relating to private property
- Matrimonial disputes and other disputes purely civil in nature
- Matters where the Lokayukta would act as an appellate or supervisory authority over statutory forums

The Lokayukta Act does not override remedies provided under other statutes, such as appeals, revisions, or reviews before competent authorities or courts.

When does the Lokayukta act?

The Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta may initiate action in the following circumstances:

1. On receipt of a complaint from any citizen or aggrieved person
2. On information received through reports, representations, or matters highlighted in newspapers and media (suo motu action)
3. On a reference made by the Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh

How can a complaint be filed before the Lokayukta?

To file a complaint before the AP Lokayukta, the following procedure shall be followed:

- The complaint shall be submitted in Form I, duly signed by the complainant.
- It shall be accompanied by an affidavit in Form II, sworn and duly attested.
- A nominal fee of Rs.150/- shall be paid by way of Money Order, Demand Draft drawn in favour of the Registrar, or by cash.
- In deserving cases, the Lokayukta may exempt payment of the fee

Mode of submission

- In person before the Registrar or any officer authorized by him
- By Registered Post
- By Email in the prescribed format to: ap.lokayukta@gmail.com

The prescribed Forms I and II are available on the official website of the AP Lokayukta.

What procedure is followed after a complaint is admitted?

After admission of a complaint:

1. A preliminary verification is conducted.
2. The Concerned Authorities are given an opportunity to submit remarks.
3. A detailed investigation or inquiry may be ordered.
4. Evidence may be collected through documents, witnesses, and records.
5. After completion, findings and recommendations are recorded and communicated to the competent authority.

Does the Lokayukta have powers similar to a civil court?

Yes. While conducting investigations, the Lokayukta and Upa-Lokayukta have powers of a civil court, in the matters of:

- Summoning and enforcing attendance of witnesses
- Requiring production of documents
- Receiving evidence on affidavits
- Issuing commissions for examination of witnesses or documents

Can the Lokayukta investigate anonymous complaints?

Generally, anonymous or pseudonymous complaints are not entertained, unless the Lokayukta is satisfied that the information discloses serious allegations, and there is sufficient material to proceed independently.

Is the Lokayukta bound by the Code of Civil Procedure or the Code of Criminal Procedure?

No. The Lokayukta is not bound by technical procedures of courts. However, it follows the principles of natural justice, fairness, and due process while conducting inquiries.

Can the decisions or recommendations of the Lokayukta be challenged?

As per Section 17(3) of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act, 1983, no proceedings, decision, finding, or recommendation of the Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta shall be liable to be challenged, reviewed, quashed, or called in question in any court or tribunal.

What happens after the Lokayukta submits its report?

After the report is submitted:

- The competent authority shall inform the Lokayukta within the stipulated time about the action taken or proposed to be taken.
- If no action is taken, reasons must be communicated
- In appropriate cases, the Lokayukta may include such matters in its Annual Report.

Are the recommendations of the Lokayukta binding?

The recommendations are not directly enforceable as court orders, but:

- They carry great persuasive value.
- The Government or competent authority is expected to act in accordance with them.
- Non-compliance is required to be explained.
- If not satisfied or considers the case deserves, a special report may be made to the Governor.
- The Governor shall cause a copy thereof together with an explanatory memorandum to be laid before the Legislature.

Can the Lokayukta investigate matters pending before courts?

As a rule, the Lokayukta does not interfere in:

- Matters pending before courts or tribunals, or
- Issues finally decided by judicial forums

However, allegations of maladministration or corruption independent of judicial issues may still be examined.

What protection is given to complainants?

The Act provides:

- Confidentiality of complainant identity where required
- Protection against victimization during inquiry
- Fair hearing and transparency in proceedings

False or malicious complaints, however, may attract action as per law.

Is there any penalty for false or vexatious complaints?

Yes. If a complaint is found to be false, frivolous, or vexatious, the Lokayukta may:

- Reject the complaint with reasons
- Initiate action against the complainant as provided under the Act

This provision prevents misuse of the Institution.

How has the AP Lokayukta contributed to good governance and accountability?

The AP Lokayukta plays a crucial role in strengthening governance by addressing corruption and protecting citizens against maladministration such as delay, inefficiency, non-transparency, abuse of authority, and improper conduct.

By receiving complaints from citizens, conducting impartial inquiries, and recommending corrective and disciplinary action, the Institution ensures accountability in public administration. Where allegations are proved, the competent authorities, following due process, have imposed punishments including removal from service, pension cuts, stoppage of increments, censure, recovery of misappropriated amounts, and initiation of criminal prosecution.

The very object of the Lokayukta Act is to improve the standards of public administration and to ensure fairness, integrity, and discipline in governance machinery.

Performance during the year 2025

During the year 2025:

- The AP Lokayukta received **3,106 complaints**
- **3,654 complaints** were resolved (including pending complaints of previous years).
- Nearly **50% of the complaints** pertained to the Revenue Department.
- In **174 complaints** personal grievances have been redressed, to the full satisfaction of the respective complainants.

This reflects the growing public confidence in the Institution as an effective grievance redressal and accountability mechanism.

How frequently are reports published and how accessible are they?

The Lokayukta presents an Annual Report every year to the Hon'ble Governor of Andhra Pradesh, as mandated under Section 12(5) of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act, 1983.

These Annual Reports are placed in the public domain and are accessible through the official website of the AP Lokayukta.

What types of cases fall under the purview of the AP Lokayukta and how does it coordinate with other agencies?

The AP Lokayukta has jurisdiction over complaints against a broad spectrum of public servants including Ministers, Legislators, Local Government functionaries, University officials, and employees of statutory bodies and public institutions.

During the course of investigation, the Lokayukta may seek assistance from or coordinate with other investigative agencies such as the police and anti-corruption bodies, wherever necessary, depending on the nature of the case.

What is the level of public awareness about the AP Lokayukta?

The steady increase in the number of complaints filed before the Lokayukta clearly demonstrates growing public awareness about the existence, role, and effectiveness of the Institution.

Periodic media reports on grievance redressal, disciplinary action against erring public servants, and consequential punishments further contribute to public awareness.

Additionally, pursuant to the directions of the Hon'ble Executive Chairman, AP State Legal Services Authority, District Legal Services Authorities (DLSAs) and Mandal Legal Services Committees (MLSCs) have been instructed to include the functions and procedures of the AP Lokayukta as a subject in legal awareness campaigns across the State.

Significant interventions by AP Lokayukta during 2025

During the year 2025, the AP Lokayukta played a significant role in:

- Ensuring accountability and combating corruption in public authorities
- 55 Medical Officers have been removed from service, due to unauthorized absence, after due recommendations by this Institution.
- Incharge SRO of Kallur Mandal was awarded major penalty of withholding of five increments of pay with cumulative effect, for illegal registration of prohibited properties and undervaluation of 136 documents.
- Usage of excessive harmful chemicals for ripening of fruits. In this regard this Institution issued instructions to the Authorities to strictly implement G.O.Rt.No.288 dated 19.03.2012 and constitute District Level Committee,

intensify inspections, conduct awareness programmes, to prevent use of Calcium Carbide in ripening and transportation of fruits.

- Resolving environmental issues.
- For ensuring uninterrupted education and proper care of migrant children staying in Seasonal Hostels established under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, comprehensive instructions to the authorities to conduct surprise inspections, to follow the guidelines strictly and initiation of punitive action including blacklisting, fines, and recovery of amounts, against concerned NGOs/SHGs/Village Welfare Associations, wherever adverse remarks are reported.
- Redressal of family pension and disability pension grievances.
- Facilitating payment of ex-gratia to legal heirs of victims of electrical accidents and thunderbolt incidents.
- Addressing unauthorized layouts, illegal constructions, and encroachments on water bodies and government lands.
- Resolving general grievances such as correction of land records, issue of Pattadar Passbooks, land surveys and boundary fixation, recovery of service pension arrears, and medical reimbursement claims.

**PROACTIVE SUO-MOTU ACTIONS TO ADDRESS
PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND MAL-ADMINISTRATION**

The Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta is vested with statutory authority to initiate suo-motu investigations on its own motion in matters involving public interest, including corruption, mal-administration, abuse of official position, administrative lapses, and significant public grievances. Such action may be taken even in the absence of a formal complaint, based on information received from credible sources such as news reports, representations, inspections, or other material that discloses issues affecting good governance.

Through this mechanism, the Institution plays a pro-active and preventive role, extending beyond individual grievances and corruption cases, to address broader concerns such as hardships faced by retired pensioners in getting pension, students for obtaining original certificates by the Educational Institutions, hostel students grievances, milk adulterations, etc,. These interventions underscore the Lokayukta's commitment to safeguarding public interest, ensuring administrative accountability, and upholding the rule of law.

The following orders illustrate instances where the Hon'ble Upa-Lokayukta exercised suo-motu jurisdiction in furtherance of these objectives.

ORDER:-

This Suo-Motu complaint was registered by this Institution under Section 7(3) of the A.P. Lokayukta Act and Rule 2(8) and Rule 5 of the A.P. Lokayukta and Upa-Lokayukta (Investigation) Rules, taking the news item published in *Andhra Jyothi Daily* dated 24.02.2025 under the caption “సీజనల్ వీడి” as source material. The report highlighted serious irregularities and misappropriation of funds in the functioning of Seasonal Hostels established under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan for migrant children.

The primary objective of these Seasonal Hostels is to ensure uninterrupted education and proper care of migrant children. Therefore, this Institution had directed the State Project Director, Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, A.P., and the Commissioner of School Education, A.P., to submit action taken reports on the following issues:

1. Maintaining sanctioned student strength,
2. Providing food quality as per prescribed menu,
3. Weekly inspections by Mandal Educational Officers with photographs,
4. Surprise inspections by District Educational Officers once every month.

The State Project Director, Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan, submitted report dated 14.09.2025 enclosing ATR dated 08.05.2025, wherein it is stated that:

- 35 Seasonal Hostels were sanctioned for A.Y. 2024–25.
- Inspection teams comprising MEOs and Head Masters conducted inspections as per instructions of the District Collector, Kurnool.
- Based on inspection reports, the District Collector blacklisted **04 hostel organizers** and imposed fines on **11 organizers**, with deductions ranging from 15% to 50% from their bills.
- NGOs and Village Welfare Organizations were instructed to adhere strictly to guidelines.
- As a result, significant improvements were noticed in food quality, care, and functioning of the hostels.
- All Seasonal Hostels in Kurnool District were closed by 31.03.2025 after completion of the migration season.

No report has been received from the Commissioner of School Education, despite notice.

On perusal of the material available, this Institution is satisfied with the corrective measures taken by the Collector & District Magistrate, Kurnool, and the field-level functionaries under Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan. Their actions led to improvement in hostel functioning, accountability, and service delivery to children.

However, to prevent recurrence of such irregularities across the State, uniform monitoring and enforcement mechanisms must be ensured in all districts.

Accordingly, while discontinuing further enquiry in this Suo-Motu complaint, **this Institution recommends that:**

The Commissioner, School Education Department, A.P., Vijayawada, shall issue suitable and comprehensive instructions to all District Collectors & Chairman, Samagra Shiksha in the State to:

1. Constitute inspection teams comprising Mandal Educational Officers and Head Masters for weekly inspections of all Seasonal Hostels.

2. Ensure surprise inspections by District Educational Officers at least once every month.
3. Enforce strict compliance with guidelines relating to student strength, food quality, cleanliness, safety, and welfare standards.
4. Take appropriate punitive action including blacklisting, fines, and recovery of amounts, against concerned NGOs/SHGs/Village Welfare Associations, wherever adverse remarks are reported.
5. Submit consolidated compliance reports to the Commissioner's office periodically.

With this recommendation, the Suo-Motu complaint stands **closed**.

ORDER:-

This complaint has been Suo moto registered by this Institution on the basis of new paper report published in Sakshi daily News Paper Kurnool edition dated 06.02.2025 under the caption “**ప్రజరీల్లోలంచావతారులు!**”.

According to the news report, rampant corruption is prevalent in the Sub-Treasuries of Kurnool and Nandyal. Public servants in the treasury department are reportedly harassing retired Government employees by demanding commissions for processing Pension / conversion of Family Pension, Pension arrears, Commutation, Gratuity, and other financial entitlements. It is alleged that some officials are demanding 2% to 4% commissions to process these bills and conversion of family pension matters. Despite receiving pension payment orders from the AG / State Audit offices, these officials are deliberately delaying the process to extract bribes from the concerned retired employees / Family Pensioners.

The news report highlights specific instances faced by the retired employees i.e., one case involves a retired employee from the Government General Hospital, Kurnool, who was harassed for money to finalize her pension proposals. Another case involves a woman retired employee from the Irrigation Department facing similar harassment.

This Institution under orders dated 07.02.2025 issued the following directions:-

1. The **District Treasury Officer, Kurnool** is directed to conduct a confidential probe into the allegations against officials of the Sub-Treasury offices under his/her jurisdiction. This probe should be conducted without any involvement of the delinquent Public Servants. A detailed report should be submitted along with the required particulars of each Sub-Treasury office, for the period from 01.10.2024 to 31.01.2025 using the prescribed pro-forma.
2. Similarly, the **District Treasury Officer, Nandyal** is directed to conduct a confidential probe into the allegations against officials of the Sub-Treasury offices under his/her jurisdiction. This investigation must be carried out without any involvement of the delinquent Public Servants. A comprehensive report should be submitted along with the required particulars in the prescribed format.
3. Further to ensure timely processing of pensions, conversion of family pensions, and other pensionary benefits of retired and deceased employees, **the Director of Treasuries & Accounts Department, Government of AP** is hereby directed:-
 - (i) to issue instructions to all the concerned Sub-Treasury Officers to minimize delays in processing pension-related matters.
 - (ii) Establish **state-level helpline phone numbers** for pension-related grievances and direct all District and Sub-Treasury Offices across the state to **display these helpline numbers** for easy access by pensioners and family pensioners and ensure appropriate mechanisms are in place for **grievance redressal and timely action**.

In pursuance of the orders of this Institution, the Director of Treasuries and Accounts, AP, Mangalagiri submitted his report dated 12.03.2025 stating that:-

- 1) Vide Office Circular Memo dated 17.02.2025, instructions have been issued to all the Treasury Officers in the State to avoid delay in processing the pensionary benefits claims and also to take necessary steps to avoid returning the bills by the treasury personnel, intentionally.
- 2) As per the reports of the District Treasury and Accounts Officers of Kurnool & Nandyal, there was no abnormal delays occurred in transferring of PPOs/ Pension conversions at District Treasury / Sub Treasury Offices respectively.
- 3) The subject issue was taken to the notice of the Government to provide helpline provision to the Treasury Officers in the State to monitor the pensioners, family pensioners and employees to raise the queries / complaints if any, for redressing their grievances without any delay. Orders are awaited from the Government in this regard.
- 4) Several steps have been taken to resolve the pension issues as follows:-
 - (a) The grievances of pensioners received from various channels i.e., directly from individuals, Hon'ble Courts, CMP Office, Collector's Grievance Cell (SPANDANA), Government Grievance Mechanism (PGRS Portal), Print Media & Pensioners Associations etc., all the (26) District Treasury Officers in the State and DTA at State level are monitored and immediate necessary action has been taken and intimated the same to the concerned authorities / pensioners.
 - (b) The Treasury Officials are conducting coordination meetings with all the Pensioner Associations and also monthly reviews are being taken by them from Pensioners Associations. The same has been rectified by the Office from time to time.
 - (c) The mechanism to redressal of grievances of pensioners, grievance cell is available in the District Treasuries along with the Office.

The District Treasury & Accounts Officers, District Treasury, Kurnool and Nandyal submitted their respective reports dated 20.03.2025 along with enclosures and the same are to the following effect:-

- 1) The information related to pension processed between the period from 01.10.2024 to 31.01.2025 has been ascertained from all the sub treasuries under the jurisdiction of respective treasury units of Kurnool & Nandyal and consolidated at District Treasury Offices, Kurnool & Nandyal respectively. The Verification Committees comprising of one Assistant Treasury Officer and one Sub Treasury Officer from the respective Kurnool and Nandyal Districts have been formed without any involvement of delinquent public servants from the respective districts to conduct a confidential probe. The respective Verification Committees have submitted their reports and the reports do not reflect any intentional delays in processing pensioner emoluments. As per the Verification Committee reports, the allegations published in news item are false and baseless. Post implementation of CFMS the payment gateway is managed by the Government and clear the claims accordingly.
- 2) The news article has not completely disclosed any details of delay of two pensions of Medical and Irrigation Departments. However, all the pensions related to Medical and Irrigation Department were verified for delays, if any and after verification no significant delays are found in processing pensions related to Medical and irrigation Departments. There is no manual intentional delay and if there is any delay occurred that would be due to technical problem on introduction of CFMS. The Director of Treasuries and Accounts have clearly instructed to avoid delays in processing the pensions and the same have been communicated to all the Assistant Treasury Officers/ Sub Treasury Officers in the Treasury Units of Kurnool and Nandyal for strict implementation and to avoid deviations.
- 3) Further the Director of Treasuries and Accounts, AP has proactively given instructions vide DTA Memo dated 27.10.2023 to conduct coordination meetings with pensioner associations and understand their grievances and provide immediate solutions. Accordingly, frequent coordination meetings are being conducted to take the grievances and to avoid any sort of inconvenience to the pensioners (Copies of minutes of meetings conducted by the Kurnool and Nandyal District Treasury Offices are enclosed to the reports).

- 4) **In pursuance of the orders of this Institution, the Phone Number of the Officer concern for Pensions at District Treasury Offices of Kurnool and Nandyal Districts are displayed in the Notice Boards of all the Sub Treasury Offices in Treasury Units of Kurnool and Nandyal Districts respectively (Photocopy of all the Sub Treasury Units are enclosed to the reports):-**

- 2. Helpline Phone No. of the Nandyal District Treasuries Department is 9849388295.**

The District Treasury and Accounts Officers finally submitted that the data of all the Sub Treasuries under the respective Treasury Units of Kurnool & Nandyal will be captured in the prescribed proformas on regular intervals and they will be reviewed with the respective Sub Treasury Officers on monthly basis to ensure that there are no intentional delays and to avoid hardships to the pensioners.

Perused the material on record.

Upon consideration of the action taken reports submitted by the Director of Treasuries and Accounts, AP and the District Treasury and Accounts Officers, Kurnool and Nandyal Districts, proceeding with further investigation into this complaint is not required and this complaint is **closed**, by recording the reports of the Director of Treasuries and Accounts, AP and the District Treasury and Accounts Officers, Kurnool and Nandyal Districts dated 12.03.2025, 20.03.2025 respectively.

COMPLAINT NO.354/2025/B2 (Milk Adulteration – Public Health Concern (Anantapur District):-

This Suo-Motu complaint was registered under orders dated 07.02.2025, based on multiple news reports in Andhra Jyothi Daily regarding rampant milk adulteration using substances like maltodextrin, posing serious risks to public health.

The Commissioner, Food Safety, Andhra Pradesh has taken actions:-

- State-wide special drive conducted,
- 215 milk samples collected across 26 districts,
- 5 samples failed quality standards,
- Statutory proceedings initiated against violators under FSS Act, 2006.

While satisfied with immediate enforcement, the Institution observed that one-time drives are insufficient and issued long-term directions:

- Quarterly unannounced inspections,
- Monthly sample testing with transparency,
- Expanded public awareness campaigns,
- Strict legal enforcement including prosecution of repeat offenders,
- Capacity building of Food Safety Officers,
- Quarterly compliance monitoring.

This complaint is closed under orders dated 26.03.2025, with continuing enforcement directions.

Complaint No.2690/2023/B1 (Encroachments on Government & Canal Lands)

On the basis of a newspaper report alleging encroachments and illegal layouts on Government, canal and assigned lands, a suo-motu case was registered and concerned Revenue Divisional Officers were directed to enquire. Detailed field enquiries revealed that most lands were either Government lands under protection, private patta lands with due permissions, or vacant without encroachments; eviction

action was initiated wherever encroachments by houseless persons were noticed. As corrective and preventive actions were taken by the authorities and allegations were not substantiated, the complaint was closed.

[COMPLAINT NO.2421/2025/B2 \(Illegal Withholding of Original Certificates by Educational Institutions\):-](#)

Based on a news report published in Andhra Jyothi Daily dated 18.09.2025, highlighting the difficulties faced by students in securing original certificates from colleges due to pending fee reimbursement claims, this Institution registered the matter Suo-Motu under orders dated 18.09.2025.

The news report revealed that educational institutions were illegally withholding students' original certificates, compelling them to pay fees that were otherwise reimbursable by the Government. This practice severely affected students' prospects for higher education and employment.

Fee reimbursement liability lies with the State, not students. Withholding certificates violates UGC and AICTE regulations. Such actions infringe upon students' educational and constitutional rights. Therefore, recommendations were issued to the Secretary to Government, Higher Education Department, the Director of Technical Education and Registrars of major State Universities including SVU, AU, ANU, SKU, RU, KU, and RGUKT for:-

- Immediate release of original certificates upon course completion.
- Acceptance of indemnity bonds/undertakings from students for any future verified dues.
- Issuance of uniform instructions by Higher Education authorities to all institutions.

[Complaint No.1961/2022/B1 \(Illegal Sand Mining\)](#)

Based on a newspaper report alleging large-scale illegal sand mining and transport, the AP Lokayukta registered a suo-motu case and ordered confidential probes by the District Collector and Police. About 500 tractor-loads of illegally

dumped sand were seized and diverted for Government works. Police established check-posts, installed CCTV cameras and intensified patrolling. Mines & Geology authorities confirmed no authorised sand reaches and no seigniorage collection. As preventive measures were taken and no official involvement was established, the complaint was closed.

**COMBATING MALADMINISTRATION AND UPHOLDING INTEGRITY IN
PUBLIC SERVICE**

The Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act empowers the person aggrieved by maladministration, corruption, misconduct, or official indiscipline of a public servant to file a complaint before this Institution in the prescribed manner. Upon receipt of such complaints, the Lokayukta or Upa-Lokayukta conducts an enquiry in accordance with law. Where it is found that the actions of a public servant have resulted in injustice, undue hardship, or abuse of official position, appropriate recommendations are made to the Competent Authority for redressal of the grievance and for initiation of disciplinary or corrective action against the delinquent official.

During the year under review, the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta took cognizance of several complaints involving allegations of maladministration, corruption, and misconduct by public servants. After due enquiry and following the prescribed procedure, the concerned Competent Authorities imposed disciplinary punishments on the erring officials. In certain cases, irregular and illegal entries made in land records with oblique motives were also rectified, thereby restoring legality and protecting public interest.

Some illustrative cases enquired into by the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta during the year, resulting in disciplinary action and corrective measures, are presented in the following pages.

ORDER:-

Sri Gattupalli Mallem Konda Reddy, S/o. Singal Reddy, resident of Badvel and another filed this complaint based on news items published in Andhra Jyothi Newspaper alleging that about 11 individuals submitted fake award copies showing that their lands / houses have been acquired for Somasila Project and obtained jobs under displaced persons quota of Somasila Project in the Office of Superintending Engineer, Telugu Ganga Project and GNSS Circle, Tirupati. The complainant requested to enquire into the matter.

In response to the notices issued by this Institution, the Chief Engineer, NTR Telugu Ganga Project, Tirupati submitted his report dated 31.12.2024 and final action taken report dated 16.12.2025 stating that the Superintending Engineer, TGP & SNSS Circle, Tirupati was directed to examine the matter and submit a detailed report and he submitted the report stating that the following employees have produced fake certificates/ award copies and got appointment orders and have violated CC & A Rules and liable for dismissal from the Government service with immediate effect:-

- 1) N.Suri Babu, Junior Assistant
- 2) D.Anil Kumar Reddy, Typist

- 3) K.Rama Mohan Reddy, Typist
- 4) B.Subbaiah, Office Subordinate
- 5) P.Suresh Kumar, Technical Assistant.

The Government after careful examination of the detailed report, charges framed against the above employees and the Written Statement of Defenses submitted by the charged officers, have directed the Chief Engineer, NTR TGP, Tirupati being the competent and disciplinary authority for ministerial services under his control, to take necessary action on the above said alleged employees in accordance with G.O.Ms.No.2, G.A (Ser.C) Department dated 04.01.1999 readwith G.O.Ms.No.458 G.A. (Ser.C) Department, dated 22.09.2009. The Government further directed the Chief Engineer, NTR TGP, Tirupati to lodge criminal case (individually) against the above said employees for producing fake certificates of proof of award during the employment and to intimate the stage of the case from time to time to Government without fail and also submit action taken report to the Government along with the 5 separate FIR Copies filed against the said employees for record.

In view of the above, the Chief Engineer, NTR TGP Unit, Tirupati under separate proceedings dated 09.12.2025 imposed major penalty of **Dismissal from Services** immediately against the above said employees. Under letter dated 10.12.2025, the Chief Engineer, NTR TGP, Tirupati has requested the Superintendent of Police, Tirupati to register a criminal case against the above said employees individually marking the copies of the same to the Deputy Superintendent of Police and the Station House Officer at Tirupati and the cases are also filed in SHO, Tirupati. (Copy of separate proceedings of the Chief Engineer, NTR TGP Unit, Tirupati dated 09.12.2025 are herewith enclosed to the report).

The Complainant No.2 submitted his objections to the report of the Chief Engineer, NTR Telugu Ganga Project, Tirupati dated 31.12.2024 stating that all the charged employees are liable for dismissal from service.

In the circumstances of the case, upon considering the reports submitted by the Chief Engineer, NTR Telugu Ganga Project, Tirupati and having satisfied with the action taken by the Chief Engineer, NTR Telugu Ganga Project, Tirupati, that awarding punishment of **Dismissal from Services** against the charged employees, further enquiry into this complaint is discontinued and this complaint is closed, by recording the final action taken report submitted by the Chief Engineer, NTR Telugu Ganga Project, Tirupati dated 16.12.2025.

ORDER:

Allegation against the public servants:-

The Public Servants, issued Bogus house site pattas in Sy.No.25/4B of Dupadu Village to B.Venkata Lakhmi and P. Kanakadurga bearing Plots No.13 and 216 respectively, by taking bribe amount of Rs.4.00 Lakhs.

The Chief Commissioner of Land Administration and Special Chief Secretary, A.P submitted his reports dated 05.08.2021, 12.02.2024 and 26.08.2025 stating that the Joint Collector and Additional District Magistrate, Kurnool conducted an enquiry on the allegations made by the complainant against the public servants and submitted his reports stating that issuance of house site patta to P. Kanakardurga is in violation of rules in force. The Government issued, common disciplinary proceedings issued against both the Public Servants i.e., Smt. T. Anjana Devi, former Tahsildar Kallur Mandal and Sri K.L.Varaprasada Rao, former VRO of Lakshmipuram Village of Kallur Mandal and the Collector, Kurnool has

issued Articles of charges to the public servants, on an allegation that they are involved in issuance of bogus house site pattas in Survey No.25/4B for Ac.0.01 ½ cts (Plot No:13) to B. Venkata Lakshmi and Ac.0.01cts to SmtP.Kanaka Durga, Dupadu Village, Plot No.216 in Dupadu Village by collecting a bribe of Rs.4,00,000/- from the beneficiaries. Further, the Joint Collector, Kurnool District was appointed as Inquiry Officer to inquire into the charges issued against the said officers.

After following due procedure, the authorities awarded punishment of **“reduction to a lower stage in the time scale of pay for a period not exceeding one year, without cumulative effect and not adversely affecting her pension,”** against Smt. T. Anjana Devi, former Tahsildar, Kallur Mandal of Kurnool District and a punishment of **"withholding of two increments of pay without cumulative effect"** against Sri.K.L VaraprasadaRao, VRO, Kallur Village.

The complainant is present and requested to close this complaint.

In these circumstances of the case and upon considering the report of Chief Commissioner of Land Administration and Special Chief Secretary that the government have awarded punishment of **“reduction to a lower stage in the time scale of pay for a period not exceeding one year, without cumulative effect and not adversely affecting her pension,”** against Smt. T. Anjana Devi, former Tahsildar, Kallur Mandal of Kurnool District and a punishment of **"withholding of two increments of pay without cumulative effect"** against Sri. K.L Varaprasada Rao, VRO, Kallur Village, this complaint is **closed**, by recording the report dated 26.08.2025 of the Chief Commissioner of Land Administration and Special Chief Secretary.

COMMON ORDER:-

Since the complaints relate to the same Public Servant and are based on identical allegations, all the complaints have been clubbed together and disposed of under this common order.

Allegations against the Public Servant:-

The Public Servant who is working as Head Constable – 271 of 11th Battalion, APSP, Bhakarapet, Kadapa cheated the Government, by showing wrong date of birth 15.07.1980 instead of the original date of birth 14.12.1978 and he mentioned the name of his grandfather S.Khasim Sahebas his father in his SSC Marks list. He got the job under fake date of birth certificate and cheated the school authorities besides the Government and thereby violated Rule 3 of AP Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964.

Reports of the Commandant, XI Bn, AP Spl. Police, Bhakarpet, Kadapa:-

The Commandant and the Additional Commandant FAC of Commandant, XI Battalion, AP Spl. Police, Bhakarpet, Kadapa submitted their reports dated 19.12.2023 and 04.12.2024 respectively stating that Sri V.Kesava Reddy, Assistant Commandant of 11thBn, AP.Special Police, Bhakarpet, YSR District, who was appointed as Enquiry Officer had conducted oral enquiry against HC-271, duly examining 06 prosecution witnesses and filed (07) documents as exhibits on behalf of prosecution and submitted his minutes of enquiry, holding that the charges against the charged officer are “Proved” vide C.No.10/Ac-I/C A G & BTC Coys / XI Bn/OE-06/2020, dated 05.03.2021. The provisional decision on the OEPR against S.Z.Shareef, Head Constable-271 is proposed by the Disciplinary authority as follows:-

“1. **“Postponement of Increment for a period of one year without effect on his future increments and pension”**.”

2. “His suspension period w.e.f.25.02.2020 to 15.07.2020 FN to be treated as on duty” vide G.O.Ms.No.238, dated 07.04.1992 and FR 54 (b) (3).”

The complete OEPR file Minutes of Enquiry report containing pages 01 to 781 along with legal opinion, Chief Office orders, service particulars and defaulter sheet in r/o S.Z.Shareef, HC -271 have been sent to the Director General of Police, AP, Mangalagiri vide Lr.Rc.No.08/OEPR-A3/2020-24, dated 26.03.2024 for taking further necessary action. The orders are yet to be received from the Government in this regard.

The complainant in C.No.537/2022/B2, vide representation dated 10.02.2025, has requested for removal of the public servant from service, citing that the charges have been proved.

Perused the material on record. This Institution does not have the jurisdiction to interfere with or direct the nature or severity of the punishment to be imposed in departmental proceedings, which falls squarely within the purview of the disciplinary authority concerned. In view of this circumstance and as the enquiry has been completed against the public servant and final decision is pending with the government, further enquiry into this complaint is discontinued and this complaint is **closed**, by recording the report of the Additional Commandant FAC of Commandant, XI Battalion, AP Spl. Police, Bhakarpet, Kadapa dated 04.12.2024 and **the Director General of Police, AP is hereby recommended** to take further course of action as per law and rules.

ORDER:-

The complainant and other Villagers of P.Anantapuram, Kondapuram Mandal filed this complaint alleging that the Revenue Officials irregularly made entries in respect of Ac.50.00 of government land situated in Sy.No.450, 451, 452 & 453 of P.Anantapuram Village in the name of third parties and also issued Pattadar passbooks and title deeds.

In response to the notices issued by this Institution, the Collector and District Magistrate, YSR District submitted his reports dated 07.12.2020, 30.01.2021, 08.09.2021, 17.02.2023, 30.11.2023 and the Chief Commissioner of Land Administration & Spl. CS, AP submitted his action taken report dated 23.04.2025 and the same are to the following effect:-

- 1) As per RSR of P.Anantapuram Village, Kondapuram Mandal, the land in Sy.No.200A extent Ac.53.65 is A.W. land and the same is subdivided vide 8A No.9/69 into 23 new Sy.Nos. were formed i.e., 200A/1, 200A/2, 200A/3, 200A/4, 450/1, 450/2, 450/3, 451/1, 451/2, 451/3, 451/4, 451/5, 451/6, 451/7, 452/1, 452/2, 452/3, 452/4, 452/5, 453/1, 453/2, 453/3, 454.
- 2) The digital signatures for excess extent of the aforementioned lands in Sy.Nos.200A & 423 have been removed and disciplinary action will be initiated against the erring

employees, for making illegal entries in respect of excess extent in webland, as per CCA Rules duly affording an opportunity of hearing and action will be taken.

- 3) The encroachment in Sy.Nos.451/1 and 451/5 was already halted and residential houses were already constructed long ago and they are residing in the said houses without any objections from the land holders. Most of them are houseless poor persons and some of them are displaced persons.
- 4) The then Tahsildar, Kondapuram while furnishing details of irregular entries made in webland had recommended the Revenue Divisional Officer, Jammalamadugu to delete the said irregular entries and accordingly, the then Revenue Divisional Officer, Jammalamadugu has conducted enquiry and passed orders for deletion of the entries made irregularly in Sy.No.423 and its sub-divisions vide Ref.No.E/600/2019, dated 26.06.2021 as the said lands are Government lands and entered the same without following due process of law. Accordingly, the Tahsildar, Kondapuram has deleted irregular entries made in respect of lands in Sy.Nos.423/A4, 423/4P4, 423/P26, etc., and 472. The Tahsildar, Kondapuram has revoked and removed the said lands, which are entered illegally, from discrepancy register.
- 5) The Article of Charges have been framed against the officers 1) Sri.P.Shakshavali, the then Tahsildar, Kondapuram(now retired) and 2) V. Rajesh Uday Santhosh, the then Tahsildar, Konadapuram and presently working as Tahsildar, Yerpedu Mandal, Tirupathi District who are responsible for entering the illegal entries. But,Sri K.Venkata Subbanna, the then Tahsildar, Kondapuram who is also responsible for the illegal entries in the instant case died on 19.06.2017.
- 6) As per Rule 9 of A.P.Revised Pension Rules, 1980, no disciplinary action is necessary against Sri P.Shakshavali, the then Tahsildar, Kondapuram (now retired).
- 7) Further, the Joint Collector, YSR District Kadapa was appointed as Inquiry Officer to inquire into the charges framed against Sri V.Rajesh Uday Santhosh, former Tahsildar, Kondapuram Mandal and the Inquiry Officer submitted her report of enquiry for taking further action in the subject matter. After perusal of charge issued, explanation submitted by the Charged Officer and findings of the Inquiry Officer, a punishment of “withholding of one annual grade increment without cumulative effect” is imposed against the Charged Officer.

From the reports submitted by the Authorities it is clear that excess extents mentioned in respect of lands in Sy.Nos.200A, 423 have been removed and irregular entries made in

respect of subject lands were deleted in webland adangal and the Government imposed punishment of “withholding of one annual grade increment without cumulative effect” against V.Rajesh Uday Santhosh, former Tahsildar, Kondapuram Mandal, who is responsible for entering the illegal entries.

In the circumstances and upon considering the reports submitted by the Collector and District Magistrate, YSR District and action taken report submitted by the Chief Commissioner of Land Administration, AP dated 23.04.2025, further enquiry into this complaint is discontinued and this complaint is **closed**, by recording the action taken by the Revenue Authorities in rectifying the irregular land entries and also in taking action against the then Tahsildar by awarding punishment of “withholding of one annual grade increment without cumulative effect” for making irregular entries in land records in respect of Government lands.

Sri Pulivarthi Devasahayam, Pullameraka Village, Kuchinapudi Post, Nizampatnam Mandal, Guntur District filed this complaint about the financial misconduct and misappropriation of MGNREGS funds of Nizampatnam Village by the Public Servants (1) K.Mathew Babu, MPDO, (2) B.Nipun Vamsi, Technical Assistant and (3) Y.Venkateswarlu, Computer Operator cum Accounts Assistant.

In pursuance of the notices issued by this Institution the authorities have submitted reports from time to time. The Collector and District Audit Coordinator, MGNREGS, Guntur submitted his reports dated 26.10.2015 & 13.12.2021, the Director, Panchayat Raj & Rural Development, AP submitted his reports dated 10.10.2024 & 26.12.2024 and the Project Director, DWMA, Bapatla submitted his final action taken report dated 05.07.2025 and the same are to the following effect:-

- 1) Articles of charges have been framed against K.Mathew Babu, MPDO/Project Officer, Nizampatnam, by the Commissioner, Panchayat Raj and Rural Employment, AP for the financial irregularities of Rs.6,97,168/- and the enquiry is in progress.
- 2) Final orders were issued under proceedings dated 23.05.2013 duly terminating the services of B.Nipun Vamsi, Technical Assistant, MGNREGS, Nizampatnam besides ordering for recovery of misappropriation amount of Rs.10,64,265/- within a period of 15 days.

- 3) Services of Y.Venkateswarlu, Computer Operator, MGNREGS, Nizampet were terminated under Proceedings dated.27.09.2014.
- 4) Criminal case is registered in Cr.No.26/2015 against B.Nipun Vamsi, Technical Assistant, K. Mathew Babu, MPDO/Project Officer, Nizampatnam, Y. Venkateswarlu and others and finally the police filed charge sheet against Nipun Vamsi, K.Dayanand, K.Mathew Babu, Y.Venkateswarlu, K.Sarvan Kumar, N.Vishnumurthy, N.Radhakrishna u/s.409, 420 r/w 34 IPC.
- 5) Under proceedings dated.29.04.2015 the Commissioner, Panchayat Raj & Rural Development reduced the final recovery amount from 30,39,384/- to Rs.24,21,020/-.
- 6) Rs.4,22,928/- has been recovered from Mathew Babu, MPDO and a report has been sent to the Government and the same is under examination of the Government and final report will be submitted in due course.
- 7) A sum of rupees Rs.7,30,752/- has been recovered from K.Dayanand, MPDO (Rtd). Draft articles of charges are submitted to the Government vide letter dt.16.11.2023 for taking further necessary action and orders are awaited.
- 8) Rs.10,64,245/ has been recovered from Nipun Vamshi and he was terminated from service as Technical Assistant. The matter of misappropriation of Government funds, by this individual during his tenure as Technical Assistant in MGNREGS was brought to the notice of the Agricultural Department Officials on 10.08.2013 by that time, he was already appointed as Agricultural Extension Officer, Grade-II. However, after knowing the alleged misappropriation of government funds, the service regularization and declaration of probation of the individual is kept pending, for finalization of recovery of misappropriated amount.
- 9) A sum of Rs.2,03,095/- has been recovered from Y.Venkateswarlu, Computer Operator, and he was terminated from service under proceedings of the Project Director, DWMA, Guntur dated 09.12.2013. Later, as per the orders of the Member Secretary, SRDS, O/o. Commissioner, PR&RD, vide proceedings dated 19.06.2017 his services taken as Computer Operator on outsource basis in the district besides recovery of Rs.2,03,095/-.
- 10) In total an amount of Rs.24,21,020/- has been recovered from the erring officials.

Copy of the report 05.07.2025 has been sent to the complainant for filing his objections, but the complainant has not filed his objections and the communication sent to the complainant returned unserved with postal endorsement “addressee refused, hence return to sender”.

Perused the material on record. The Authorities initiated disciplinary proceedings against the erring officials and recovered the misappropriated amount besides lodging a criminal case in C.C.No.710/2021 pending for disposal before the court and the authorities also terminated the services of Technical Assistant and Computer Operator. Under these circumstances, and upon considering the reports submitted by the authorities, proceeding with further investigation into this complaint is not required and this complaint is **closed**, by recording the report submitted by the Project Director, DWMA, Bapatla District dated 05.07.2025.

Allegation against the public servant:-

The then Sub Registrar R.Rajasekhar, SRO Adoni, Kurnool District by indulging into corrupt practices allowed the registration of the document bearing No.5352/2023 of Sub Registrar Office, Adoni, in respect of the property of an extent of Ac.1.21 of Parvathipuram Village, 16th Ward within the municipal limits of Adoni, without adopting correct stamps duty values applicable to the document, and thereby violated the provisions of Section 27 of the Indian Stamps Act and caused a loss of Rs.20,26,200/- to the State Exchequer.

Action taken by the Inspector General of Registration & Stamps Department, AP:-

In pursuance of the notices issued by this Institution, the Inspector General of Registration & Stamps Department, AP submitted his reports dated 02.04.2025 and 28.08.2025 stating that while furnishing the details of challans, the District Registrar Registration and Stamps Department (R&S), Kurnool submitted a report stating that the total deficit amount of Rs.20,26,200/- was recovered from the parties to the document No.5352/2023. Disciplinary action has been initiated against R.Rajasekhar, Sub-Registrar, SRO, Adoni, who registered the document No.5352/2023, under A.P.C.S (CC&A) Rules 1991 and imposed a penalty of stoppage of increment for three years without cumulative effect under Rule 9(iv) of the Andhra Pradesh Civil Services (Classification, Control

&Appeal) Rules, 1991, vide proceedings No.G/1603/2023 dated 12.09.2024 of the Deputy Inspector General of Registration and Stamps Department, Kurnool.

Copies of the reports of the Inspector General of Registration & Stamps Department, AP, have been sent to the complainant for filing his objections, but the complainant has not filed his objections.

In the circumstances of the case, upon considering the reports submitted by the Inspector General of Registration & Stamps Department, AP, further investigation into this complaint is discontinued. This Institution, places on record its appreciation for the initiative of the complainant in bringing the irregularity to notice, which led to appropriate corrective and disciplinary action by the Authorities. With the above observations, the complaint stands **closed**.

**GRIEVANCES OF BOTH PUBLIC AND SPECIFIC INDIVIDUALS:
COGNIZANCE, ENQUIRY AND REDRESSAL**

Consequent upon the amendments brought into force by Act-11 of 2011 with effect from 05.05.2011, the scope and jurisdiction of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta have been significantly widened by incorporating Clauses (ea) and (fa) in Section-2 of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta Act, 1983. By virtue of these amendments, allegations of mal-administration and matters relating to redressal of grievances of complainants against Public Servants have expressly been brought within the purview of this Institution.

In exercise of the powers conferred under the amended Act, the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta has been taking cognizance of complaints involving grievances of both the general public as well as specific individuals, where such grievances arise on account of acts of mal-administration, omission, delay, arbitrariness or abuse of official position by Public Servants. The Institution has actively pursued such complaints with the concerned Departments and Authorities and ensured redressal wherever the grievances were found to be genuine and substantiated.

The grievances dealt with during the year broadly include general grievances affecting the public at large, such as encroachments into water bodies, illegal or unauthorized constructions, obstruction to public pathways, non-implementation of statutory duties by local and revenue authorities, and similar matters involving public interest. In addition, the Institution has also addressed specific individual grievances, including irregular mutation or change of names in land and revenue records, non-sanction or abnormal delay in settlement of retirement benefits, irregular fixation of pay, and issues relating to General Provident Fund (GPF) and other service benefits.

Some illustrative cases enquired into by the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta during the year, wherein effective intervention resulted in timely redressal of grievances and corrective administrative action, are presented in the following pages. These cases reflect the role of the Institution as an accessible and effective forum for addressing public grievances and promoting fairness, transparency and accountability in public administration.

LOKAYUKTA IN NEWS MEDIA

During the year 2025, the Institution of the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta continued to play a proactive and impactful role not only in redressing individual grievances but also in safeguarding public interest by responding to issues of wider societal concern. Apart from dealing with complaints received from aggrieved citizens, the Lokayukta also took Suo-motu cognizance of news reports published in print and electronic media wherein grave, specific, and credible allegations were made against public servants and lapses in governance.

In several such instances, preliminary examination and further action were initiated wherever warranted, thereby reinforcing the Institution's commitment to transparency, accountability, and good governance. The Lokayukta also ensured that important orders, particularly those resulting in imposition of penalties or disciplinary action against erring officials, were given due publicity through media channels. This approach served a dual purpose: creating public awareness about the functioning and effectiveness of the Institution, and acting as a deterrent against maladministration and corrupt practices among public servants.

Further, decisions and actions of the Lokayukta on matters having significant social relevance and public impact were consciously highlighted through media coverage. Such dissemination helped in enhancing public confidence, strengthening the visibility and credibility of the Institution, and encouraging citizens to approach the Lokayukta freely for redressal of their grievances.

As a result of these initiatives, the Office of the Lokayukta remained in the public discourse throughout the year under review, with several of its interventions and orders receiving wide attention in the news media. A few illustrative instances where the Lokayukta's actions attracted media coverage are highlighted below:-

THE annual report of Lokayukta for 2024 has presented a comprehensive overview of the institution's initiatives, achievements, and challenges encountered during the period from January 1, 2024, to December 31, 2024.

Upalokayukta P Rajani, who is performing the duties of Lokayukta submitted the annual report to Governor Justice S Abdul Nazeer at Vijayawada on Monday.

The report recorded increased public trust and grievance redressal. In 2024, Lokayukta received a total of 2,597 complaints, reflect-

ing growing public confidence in the institution's ability to address grievances and uphold accountability. Kurnool district recorded the highest number of complaints at 431, followed by Krishna district with 230 and Visakhapatnam with 157. However, districts such as Parvathipuram Manyam (9 complaints) and Alluri Sitarama Raju (23 complaints) reported fewer complaints, indicating the need to improve awareness and accessibility in these

regions.

Despite the high volume of complaints, the Lokayukta successfully resolved 2,327 complaints during the year, demonstrating remarkable efficiency in grievance redressal. Although the highest number of complaints was resolved in 2023 (3,026 complaints), the consistent efforts of the Lokayukta continue to ensure timely and effective responses to public concerns.

The Lokayukta has confirmed substantial recovery

of misappropriated public funds. The Lokayukta facilitated the recovery of Rs61,27,64,314/- during the year 2024, highlighting the institution's unwavering commitment to safeguarding public funds.

Key recoveries include Rs52,78,48,436 of irregularly diverted NHM Central Government funds.

Rs2,60,64,401 of misappropriated MGNREGS funds, Rs99,09,312 from unauthorised layout owners and irregular land-use applications in Bhimavaram Municipality.

Rs1,97,65,412 of additional MGNREGS funds was misused in various instances. Rs1,25,87,000 in library cess was paid to Zilla Grandalaya Samsthas. Other recoveries include Rs43,73,600 from a cooperative society president and Rs3,00,000 from negligent medical officers.

These efforts demonstrate the Lokayukta's success in reclaiming misappropriated funds and ensuring they are

restored to public use.

The Lokayukta addressed several critical environmental and land-related issues during 2024. A notable case involved environmental concerns caused by the operations of Dalmia Cements (Bharath Ltd.), which led to air and dust pollution, crop damage, and public health hazards. Following the Lokayukta's intervention and recommendations, the Government of Andhra Pradesh constituted a High-Level Grievance Redressal Committee through GO.Ms. No.90 dated 17.12.2024, marking a significant step toward resolving the grievances of the affected villagers.

The Lokayukta also took firm action to prevent encroachment, unauthorized sand reaches, illegal sand mining, and irregular land entries.

Revenue authorities were directed to rectify irregular land records and take corrective action to prevent further violations.

HYDERABAD: Andhra Pradesh upa lokayukta, Justice P Rajani, has approved monetary compensation for residents of Chilakaladona village in Kurnool district, nearly 11 years after a complaint was first filed regarding submerged agricultural lands due to the Guru Raghavendra reservoir project.

The original complaint was lodged by farmer Raghava Reddy, who sought redress for crop damage caused by the submergence of farmlands. Farmers had demanded 20,000 per acre as

compensation. However, following a detailed review by the district collector and the water resources department, a revised compensation of 25,296 each was approved for 53 identified beneficiaries.

The complainant, Raghava Reddy, was awarded 8,013. So far, 26 of the 53 beneficiaries have received the compensation. Justice Rajani has directed authorities to ensure that the remaining disbursements are completed at the earliest.

55 doctors terminated for prolonged absence
Kurnool: Following a complaint to the Lokayukta alleging the prolonged unauthorised absence of 78 doctors in government hospitals and medical colleges across Andhra Pradesh, the director of medical education (DME) conducted an inquiry, leading to the termination of 55 doctors. The complaint was lodged by Jampana Srinivasa Goud, ex-sarpanch of Vuyyuru, Krishna district. The DME's report, submitted on May 8, 2024, confirmed that these assistant professors and associate professors had been absent for over a year without permission, violating Rule 18A and Rule 5B of AP Leave Rules 1993. As per G.O.Ms.No.128 and G.O.Ms.No.129, their absence was treated as a deemed resignation. While some doctors provided explanations and were reassigned pending disciplinary action under APCS (CC&A) Rules 1991, 55 doctors failed to reply and were officially dismissed through final orders on November 24, 2023.

78 govt doctors terminated for unauthorised absence

 ANDHRA Pradesh Upa-Lokayukta P Rajani has closed a complaint filed by Jampana Srinivasa Goud, former sarpanch of Vuyyuru, regarding 78 Assistant Professors and Associate Professors working in government hospitals and medical colleges, who were absent from duty for over a year without authorization. In a press release on Thursday, the Lokayukta has stated that according to the report submitted by the Director of Medical Education (DME), AP, these doctors neither obtained prior permission nor sanctioned leave, violating Rule 18A and Rule 5B of AP Leave Rules, 1993. Based on the government orders (GO Ms No 128 & GO Ms No 129, Finance (FRI) Department, dated 1.6.2007), their prolonged absence was deemed as resignation from government service. A termination notice was published in Sakshi newspaper on July 28, 2023, instructing the absent doctors to submit explanations within 15 days. Some doctors responded and were reinstated on a temporary basis, pending disciplinary action under APCS (CC&A) Rules, 1991. 55 doctors failed to respond and were subsequently removed from service on November 24, 2023 (RC No 2150285/VCII/2023). The final opportunity for explanations was given until August 10, 2023, but those who remained unresponsive, faced termination as per Rule 10(E) of the AP State and Subordinate Service Rules, 1996. The respective controlling officers were directed to implement the terminations accordingly. The complainant was given an opportunity to raise objections to the DME's report but did not respond. Finding no contrary evidence, the Upa-Lokayukta closed the complaint, considering the grievance redressed. This decision highlights the State's strict approach to absenteeism in government healthcare institutions, ensuring that medical services remain uninterrupted for the public.

Lokayukta's intervention lead to recovery of long pending Library Cess Dues



Lokayukta helps recover library cess arrears

The Institution of Lokayukta of Andhra Pradesh ensured the recovery of ₹3.67 crore of library cess arrears from various local bodies in the undivided East Godavari district following a complaint filed by K. Sambasiva Rao, who highlighted that several Rajamahendravaram and Kakinada municipal corporations, Ramachandrapuram, Pithapuram and Tuni municipalities and all gram panchayats had failed to remit the collected library cess to the Zilla Grandhalaya Samstha between 2007-2008 and 2016-2017.

An official release said that, responding to the directions issued by the Lokayukta, the District Collector conducted inquiries and submitted multiple reports confirming the arrears.

Due to the sustained intervention and monitoring by the Lokayukta, all the above local bodies cleared their dues in full.

Accountability

This action showcased the effective intervention by the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta in upholding accountability among local bodies and ensuring the discharge of statutory obligations, and its commitment to addressing issues of maladministration and promoting transparency and responsiveness in public service delivery.

Government official penalised for illegal land registration in Kurnool

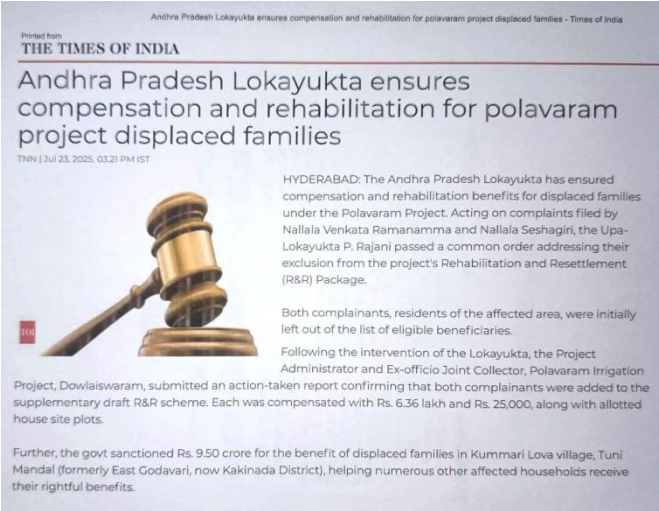

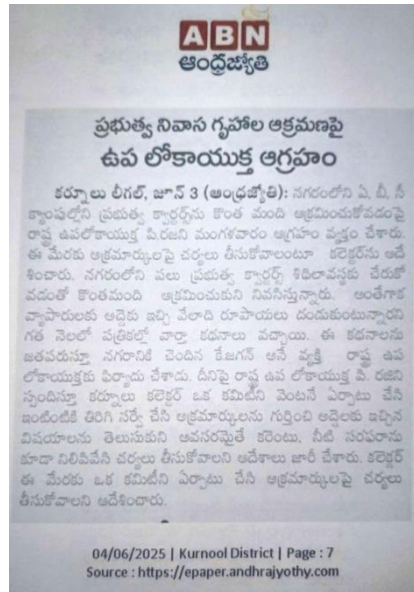
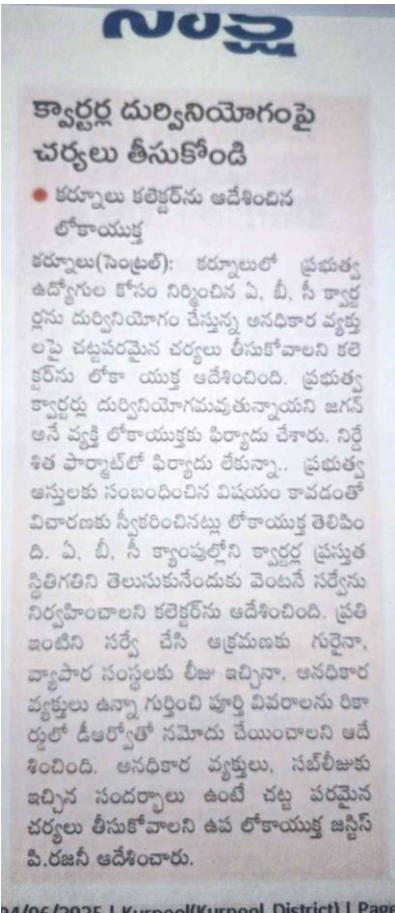

The complainant alleged that the land, which was part of the prohibited property under section 22A of the Registration Act, was unlawfully registered under multiple documents by M. Hajmijah, the senior assistant at the office of the joint sub-registrar, Kurnool. Following notices by the Upa Lokayukta, the Deputy Inspector General of Registration and Stamps Department, Kurnool, conducted an inquiry and submitted a report on January 20, 2025. Based on the report, the disciplinary authority concluded that the explanation given by the senior assistant was not convincing and penalised Hajmijah.

Two revenue officials face action for taking bribe

THE Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta has taken disciplinary action against two revenue officials after finding them guilty of bribery and the illegal issuance of house site pattas.

According to a statement released by the Lokayukta office on Friday, the case originated from a complaint filed in 2021 by V Muralidhar Reddy (File No. 795/2021/B1).

The complaint alleged that former Kallur mandal tahsildar T Anjana Devi and former Village Revenue Officer (VRO) of Lakshmipuram village, KL Varaprasad Rao, accepted a bribe of ₹4,00,000 to issue fraud-

ulent house site pattas to certain beneficiaries in Dupadu village, Survey No. 25/4B.

Upa Lokayukta P Rajani conducted an inquiry into the allegations and directed the Andhra Pradesh Chief Commissioner of Land Administration and the Kurnool Joint Collector to carry out further investigation.

Based on the findings, disciplinary measures were imposed: T Anjana Devi received a one-year pay grade reduction without affecting her pension, while KL Varaprasad Rao was penalised with the stoppage of two annual increments.

The Lokayukta officially closed the complaint.

Lokayukta: AP govt acts on corrupt authorities

Hyderabad: The Andhra Pradesh govt initiated action against corrupt officers following instructions from the AP Lokayukta. The Lokayukta directed the govt to take action against the officers after receiving a complaint from V Muralidhar Reddy of Kurnool District.

The complaint alleged that T Anjana Devi, former tahsildar of Kallur; and KL Vara Prasada Rao, village revenue officer of Lakshmipuram village, Kallur mandal, had issued bogus house site pattas in survey no. 25/48 of Dupadu village to certain beneficiaries in exchange for a bribe of ₹4 lakh. Following the institution's directions, the chief commissioner of land administration and special chief secretary, govt of AP, conducted an inquiry through the joint collector, Kurnool, Upa Lokayukta P Rajani informed on Thursday.

Pursuant to the inquiry findings, T Anjana Devi's service was reduced to a lower stage in the time scale of pay for a period not exceeding one year, without cumulative effect and without adversely affecting her pension. Furthermore, two increments of pay were withheld from Vara Prasada Rao. TNN

Govt. orders disciplinary action against two officials

The government on Friday initiated disciplinary action against two revenue officials following the directions of the Institution of Lokayukta, Andhra Pradesh, presided over by Upa Lokayukta P. Rajani. Complainant V. Muralidhar Reddy of Kurnool had alleged that T. Anjana Devi, the then Tahsildar of Kallur, and K.L. Vara Prasada Rao, Village Revenue Officer of Lakshmipuram Village in Kallur Mandal, had illegally issued bogus house site pattas in Dupadu village to certain beneficiaries by accepting a bribe of ₹4 lakh. After the due procedure, the authorities initiated disciplinary proceedings.

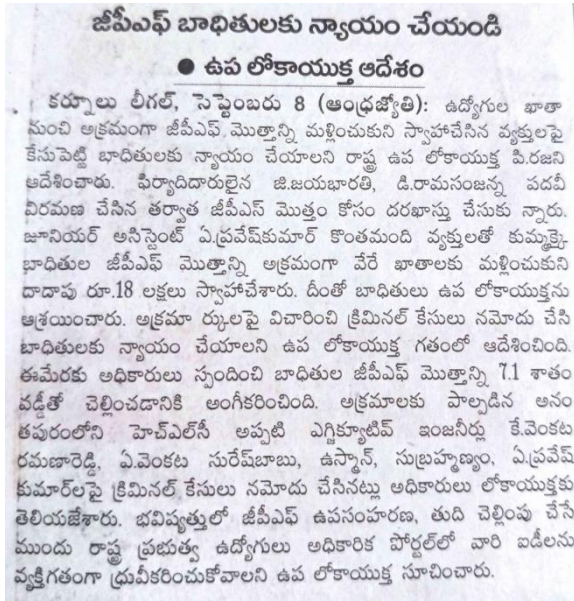
Action initiated by this Institution in GPF Fraud Case

Upa-Lokayukta uncovers GPF scam in Anantapur

STATE Upa-Lokayukta P Rajani uncovered a large-scale fraud involving the diversion of General Provident Fund (GPF) withdrawals in the High-Level Canal (HLC) Letter of Credit (LOC) Division of Anantapur. The investigation revealed that officials created duplicate beneficiary IDs to siphon off GPF funds into fake bank accounts, causing financial loss and distress to employees. The probe found ₹10 lakh meant for G Jaya Bharathi, Assistant Executive Engineer, and ₹17.14 lakh due to retired Deputy Executive Engineer DV Ramasannamma were wrongly credited. The Upa-Lokayukta's press

statement on Monday said the fraud was allegedly orchestrated by Junior Assistant A Pravesh Kumar with support from other officials, citing supervisory lapses and failure to verify beneficiary details. The institution directed the State government to reimburse the rightful GPF amounts with 7.1% interest, initiate departmental and criminal proceedings against the errant officials, and strengthen checks in the CFMS portal. A case under several Sections of IPC led to the arrest of Pravesh Kumar. The government initiated action against five officials, including former Executive Engineers K Venkata Ramana Reddy and A Venkata Suresh Babu.

Lokayukta Intervention Secures Grievance Relief

Lokayukta ensures ₹20 lakh compensation for NH land

 THE Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta and Upa Lokayukta played a crucial role in helping a landowner secure ₹20.11 lakh compensation for land acquired for the Bengaluru-Kadapa-Vijayawada Economic Corridor (NH-554G) in Prakasam district. According to a press release, P Shivayya of Musunuru village, CS Puram mandal, filed a complaint alleging that the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) took 1.72 cents of his land without

compensation. He also claimed that local officials had failed to recognise the land as private patta. Acting on the complaint, Deputy Lokayukta P Rajani directed an investigation. Officials confirmed the land's private ownership and removed it from the prohibited list. Revenue records were updated by the Tahsildar. Subsequently, the NHAI Project Director released the compensation. With Shivayya confirming full receipt, the case was formally closed by the Lokayukta.

LOKAYUKTA HELPS LANDOWNER GET COMPENSATION FOR ACQUISITION

A landpooling victim named P. Om Sivaiah finally received compensation for his 1.72 acres of land, which was acquired for the Bangalore-Kadapa-Vijayawada highway project, after the Andhra Pradesh Lokayukta office stepped in to resolve the issue. Sivaiah had earlier filed a complaint (C.No. 1558/2023/B1) with the Upa-Lokayukta, stating that he had not received the compensation for his land but that the district collector had taken no action on the matter. The Upa-Lokayukta took up the case and instructed the officials to

look into it. Following this, the collector and special collector for land acquisition in Prakasam district reviewed the matter and confirmed that the land was indeed private patta land acquired for the highway. They subsequently corrected the official records by removing the said property from the prohibited list and updating the land records. With the records cleared, the NHAI project director in Ongole was directed to release the payment. The tahsildar of C.S. Puram subsequently paid ₹20,11,645 to Sivaiah as compensation for his land, according to the Lokayukta registrar.
